

# Supplemental Information for Steam Engines at the 2022 Triennial

- Steam Engine Safety Inspections will be scheduled at the Triennial Office. When you sign up for an inspection make sure you mention if you have a current inspection documentation and the inspecting organization.
- Review our Steam Engine Safety Check List.
- We will have multiple sets of inspection equipment and inspectors. We will make every effort to get your engine qualified to run for the Triennial. Once the inspection is passed you will be issued a colored tag to be attached to your locomotive, this tag will have your basic identification information entered on it and qualification stamp. The tag is to be displayed for easy identification at the inspection station. You will also receive a copy of the inspection sheet.
- Our inspectors will be available during the Narrow Gauge Meet and will perform the Triennial Inspections and issue the documentation at this time. This will give you a leg up on those arriving in June.
- We will have an engine shuttle available at Crisp Yard to deliver your locomotive to its assigned steaming bay location. This is offered to keep the load/unload area as free as possible.
- We are looking for additional qualified inspectors. Most inspections will be made during the work week and the opening days of the meet. Volunteering for this position will impact your running very little.

Our goal is to get you safely onto the rails in a timely manner.
